LOVE YOUR LOCAL Tara Robinson, Ellerslie Automotive

How did you become involved in owning the workshop?

Ellerslie Automotive has been in the village for many years. I had been a customer since 2009, and bought the business in 2015 but it wasn't until 2021 that I got out from behind the scenes and started working in the front office.

Tell us about the Ellerslie Automotive team?

There are twelve of us, covering tyre bay, mechanical workshop and office staff. We provide WOF, service and associated mechanical repairs to pretty much all makes and models of vehicles, and can also undertake larger mechanical work like engine and transmission replacements. We are exceptionally proud to hold the MTA Best Repairer (Large Workshop) in the Northern Region.

What do you love about being an Ellerslie local?

I first went flatting in Ellerslie for a couple of years in the mid- nineties, and returned in 2001 when we bought a house in the area. Both my girls attended Ellerslie School, and I live in (and love) the area still. I like that it is busy enough to be buzzy, but enough of a village that you don't feel invisible. What's special is the local businesses are not just your average collection of high street names and you always see someone you know in the village.

How many years have you been supporting the Fairy Festival?

Well, if I include sponsoring my children with fairy outfits to attend year after year when

- For those adults who need an escape, pop in to Charlie Baxter's, Doolan Brothers or Union Post for a drink and a bite to eat (kids are welcome too!)
- Our local businesses are open as usual too – ice cream at Scoop & Smile, pies at Richoux Patisserie and Julia's Bakery, bubble tea and hot chips at Leti Bakery & Café, coffee and a bite to eat at one of our many popular cafes – the options are endless!



 If your tummy starts rumbling for lunch – grab a pizza from Hells or Pizza Hut, a burger from Gone Burger, coffee and a bite to eat from Columbus, Melba or Little Elephants, or sit in at Lowbrow, Mexico or Mr Tanaka's and watch the festival unfold

FAIRY FESTIVAL FAOS

What time should I arrive?

Amusement rides, bouncy castles, facepainting, General Collective Kids Market and food stands will be up and running from 9.30am. The magical procession, escorting our entertainers from the War Memorial Hall to their stations around the Village, begins at 10.30am with a bag piper.

Will cafes and restaurants be open?

Absolutely! Our businesses will be open as usual. If you're lucky, you might even be served by a pirate!

Which roads are closed?

From 7am until 2pm the following roads will be closed: Main Highway (between Robert and Arthur Streets), Robert Street (between Hurst Street and Main Highway) and Ladies Mile (from Robert Street carpark to Main Highway, no exit from Pukerangi Street).

Where is the best parking?

For locals, walking to the festival is recommended as street parking will be limited to side streets. Parking options in surrounding streets and public transport information is listed in the FAQs on ellersliefairyfestival.co.nz.

Where are the toilets?

Portaloos will be located on Findlay St near the Bridge of Memories and public toilets (with a change table) will be open next to the War Memorial Hall. There are also toilets inside the hall with a change table and the Plunket room will also be open for breastfeeding and changing.

Do I need cash for rides and activities?

Yes, for some you will. Face painting is \$2 p/person, and the amusement rides start from \$5 p/ride. Eftpos available and cash accepted.

What if I need help on the day?

Make your way to the Ellerslie Village information marquee in the Village Square for lost kids and general information. First Aid will be based on Arthur St next to the public toilets. You can also approach any of our fairy helpers in bright pink t-shirts or one of our Ellerslie Community Patrol team for help.
